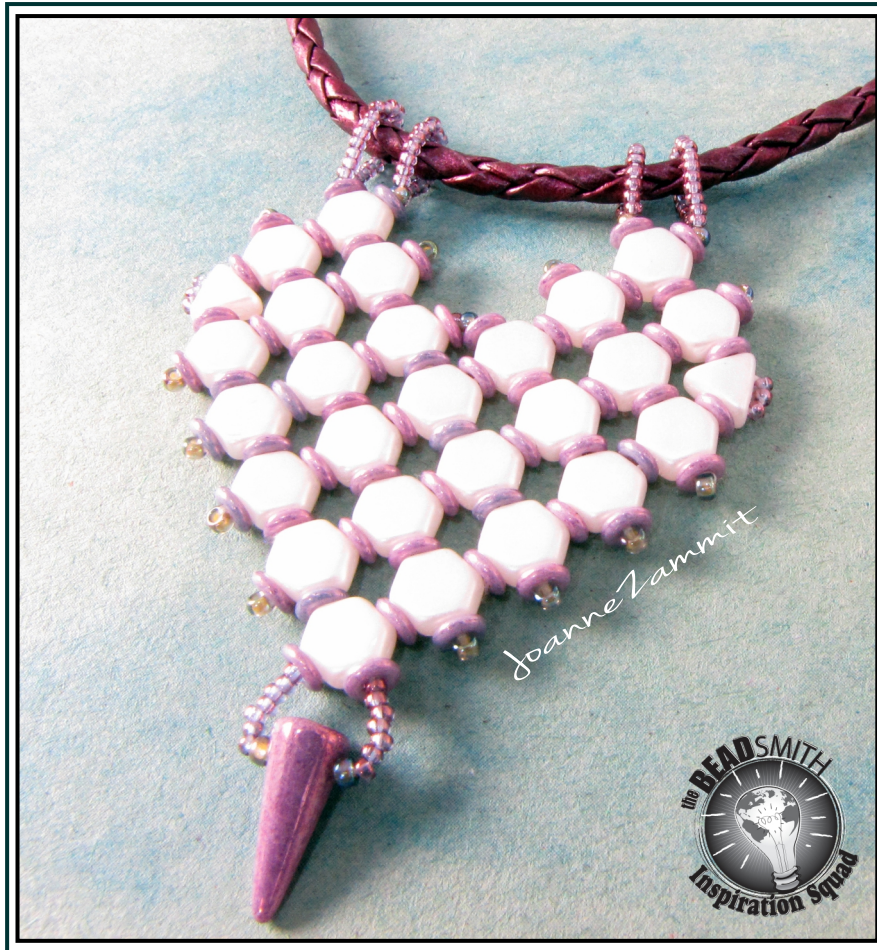


Honeycomb Heart Pendant

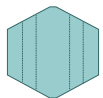

A quick and easy project using Honeycomb Beads™

Materials



Honeycomb Beads™
Qty 25

(if no Kheops in the same colour as the Honeycomb beads are available,
an additional two Honeycomb beads may be used instead)



Kheops Par Puca® Beads
Qty 2



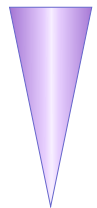

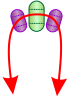
15/0 Rocailles

Czech Spike (5x13mm)
Qty 1

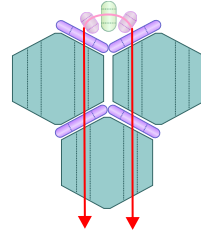
Fireline 6lb (.12mm) or 8lb (.15mm) • 2 needles size 12

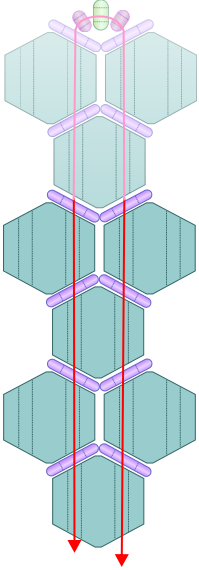
Cut a length of Fireline of 24 inches (60cm) and thread a needle on each end. With one needle pick up one 15/0, one 11/0 and one 15/0 and move the three beads to the centre of the thread.

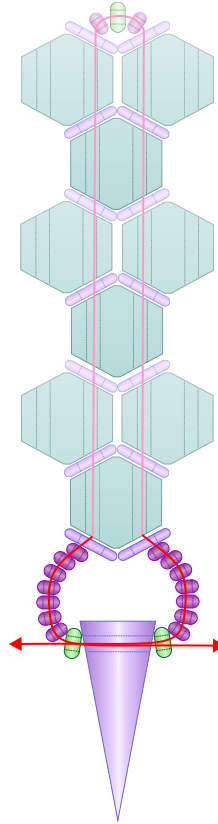
With each needle pick up one O-bead, one Honeycomb bead and one O-bead. With both needles pass through the two holes of a single Honeycomb bead.

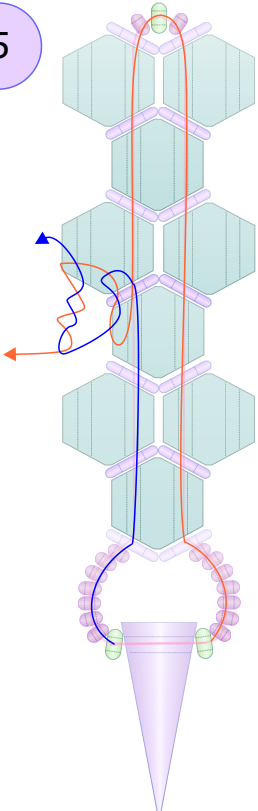
Repeat Step 2 another two times.

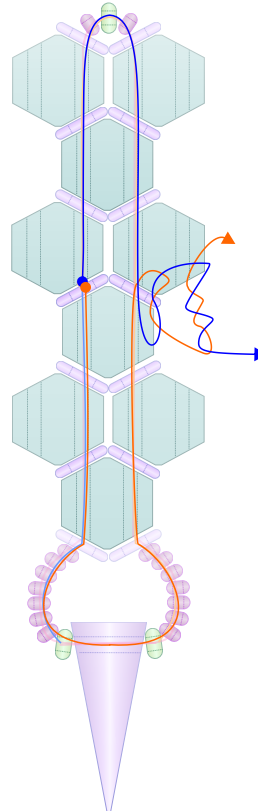
With each needle pick up one O-bead, seven 15/0's, one 11/0 and pass through the Spike bead.

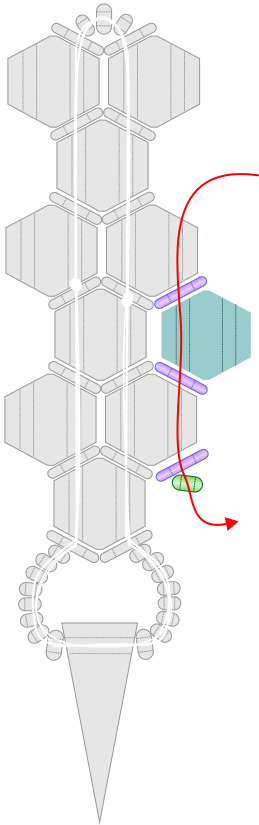
Keeping a tight tension, start to weave back through the beads. With one needle weave back half way up one side and with the other weave back all the way around until the two threads meet. Tie a surgeon's knot.

With both needles weave in opposite directions until both threads meet again on the other side. Tie another surgeon's knot and weave through a couple of beads before trimming threads.

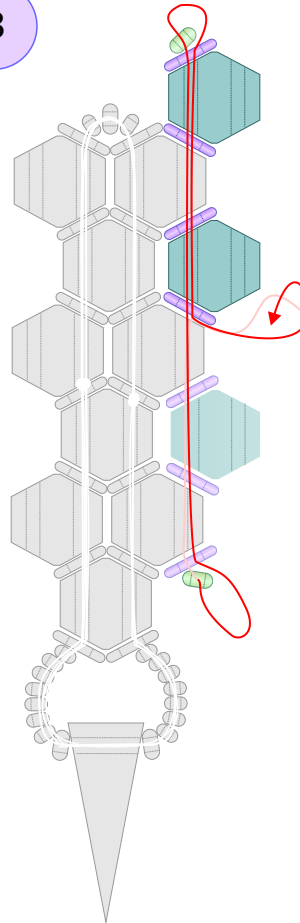

Thread a needle on both ends of a length of Fireline of approx 16 inches (40cm). With one needle go down through the outer middle Honeycomb bead leaving approx a 6 inch tail.

Pick up one O-bead, one Honeycomb bead, one O-bead and pass through the next Honeycomb bead. Pick up one O-bead and one 11/0.

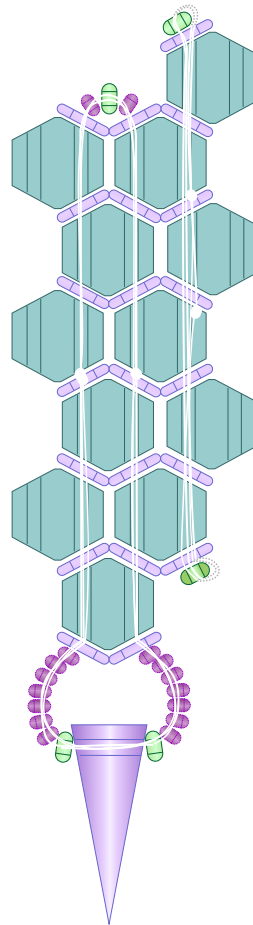

Skip the last 11/0 just picked and weave back through the O-bead and the other beads until you exit the Honeycomb bead you first entered to start this row.

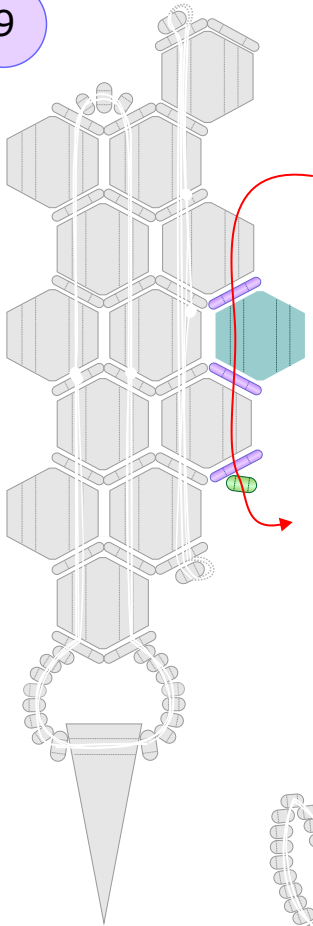
Keeping a tight tension, continue beading with the same needle. Pick up an O-bead, a Honeycomb bead, an O-bead and pass up through the top Honeycomb bead. Pick up an O-bead, a Honeycomb bead, an O-bead, an 11/0 and weave back down through the O-bead and the other beads until both threads meet.

Tie a surgeon's knot and using both needles weave up and down in opposite directions until both threads meet again. Tie another surgeon's knot and weave through a couple of beads in opposite directions before trimming threads.



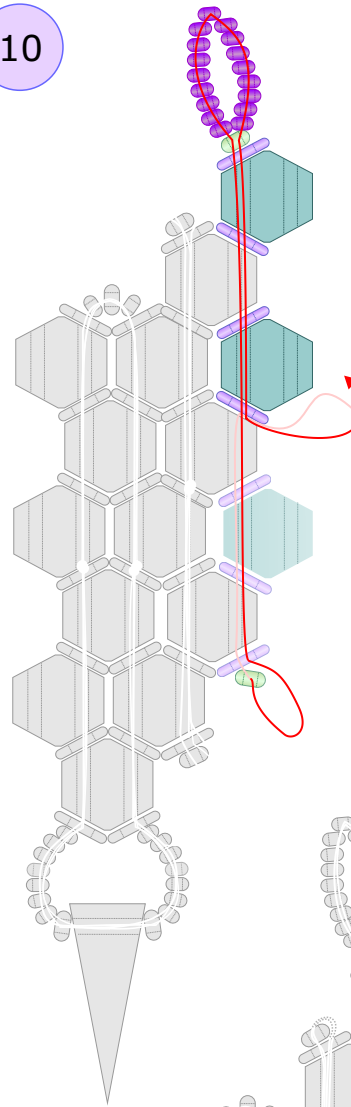
Every row is worked with a new thread to avoid 'bridges' between rows.

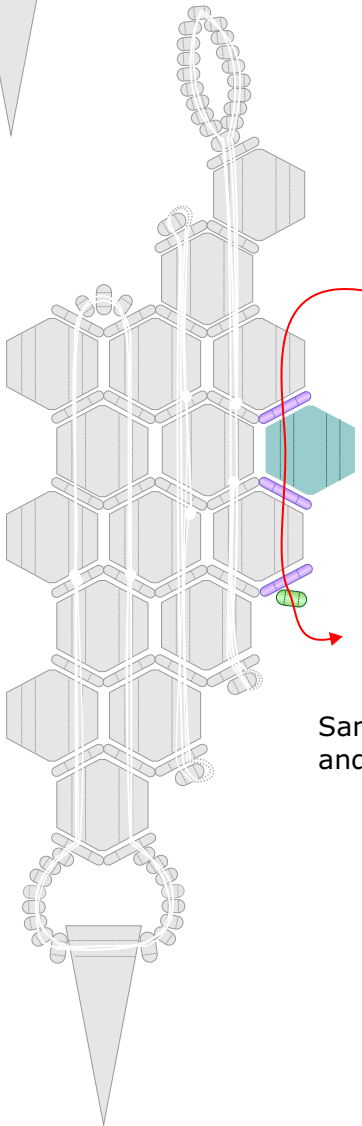
Same as Step 7.

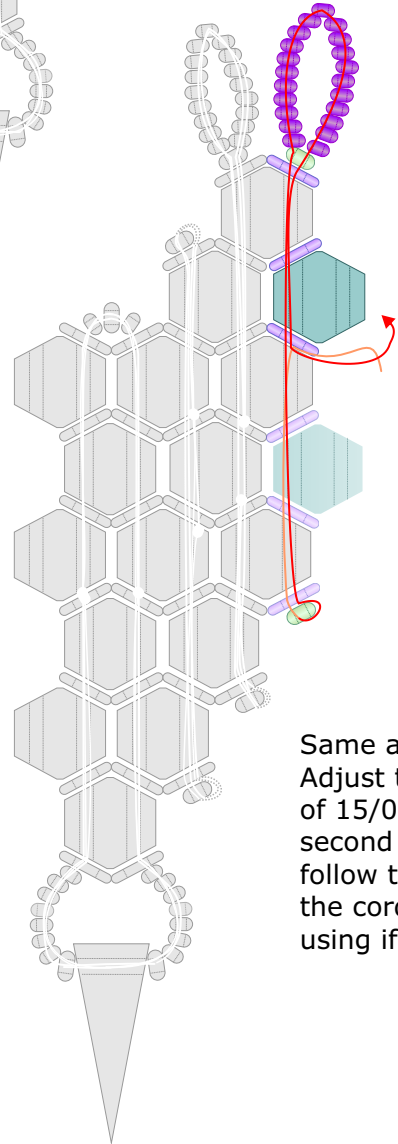
Same as Step 8 but when you exit the top Honeycomb bead pick up one O-bead, one 11/0 and a number of 15/0's to suit the cord or chain you are using. Make sure your cord or chain (including clasp if already attached and cannot be removed) pass through the loop made when you weave back through the 11/0. Weave back through all the beads, knotting and weaving through all over again before tying off.

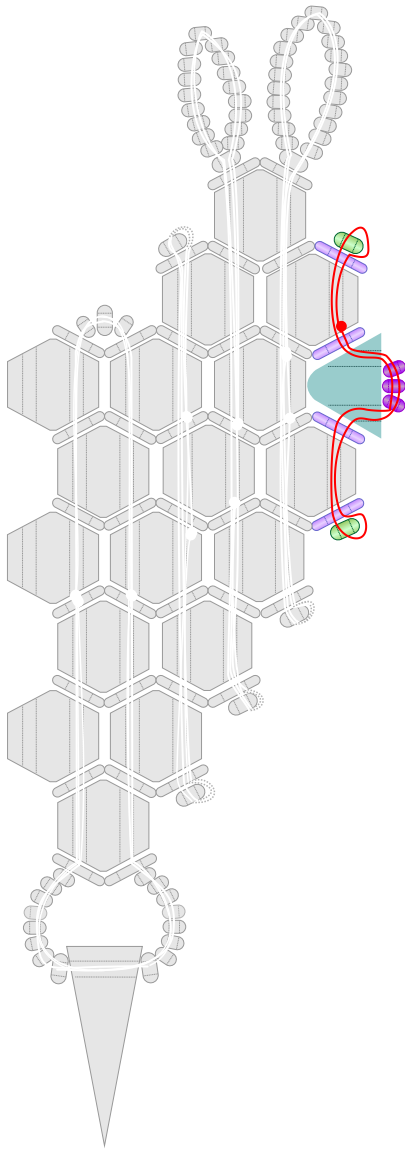
Same as Steps 7 and 9.

Same as Step 10. Adjust the number of 15/0s in the second loop to follow the curve of the cord you are using if necessary.

For the final row use a Kheops Par Puca® bead in the same colour as your Honeycomb beads if available. This gives a slightly narrower and less angular shape to the heart. If you do not have a Kheops bead use another Honeycomb bead, working exactly the same way as in previous rows.

If you are using a Kheops bead, weave through it from the narrow to the wide part and pick up three 15/0's for the outer edge.

Repeat Steps 7 to 13 on the other side to complete your heart.

The finished heart is approximately 2 inches (5 cm) wide.
